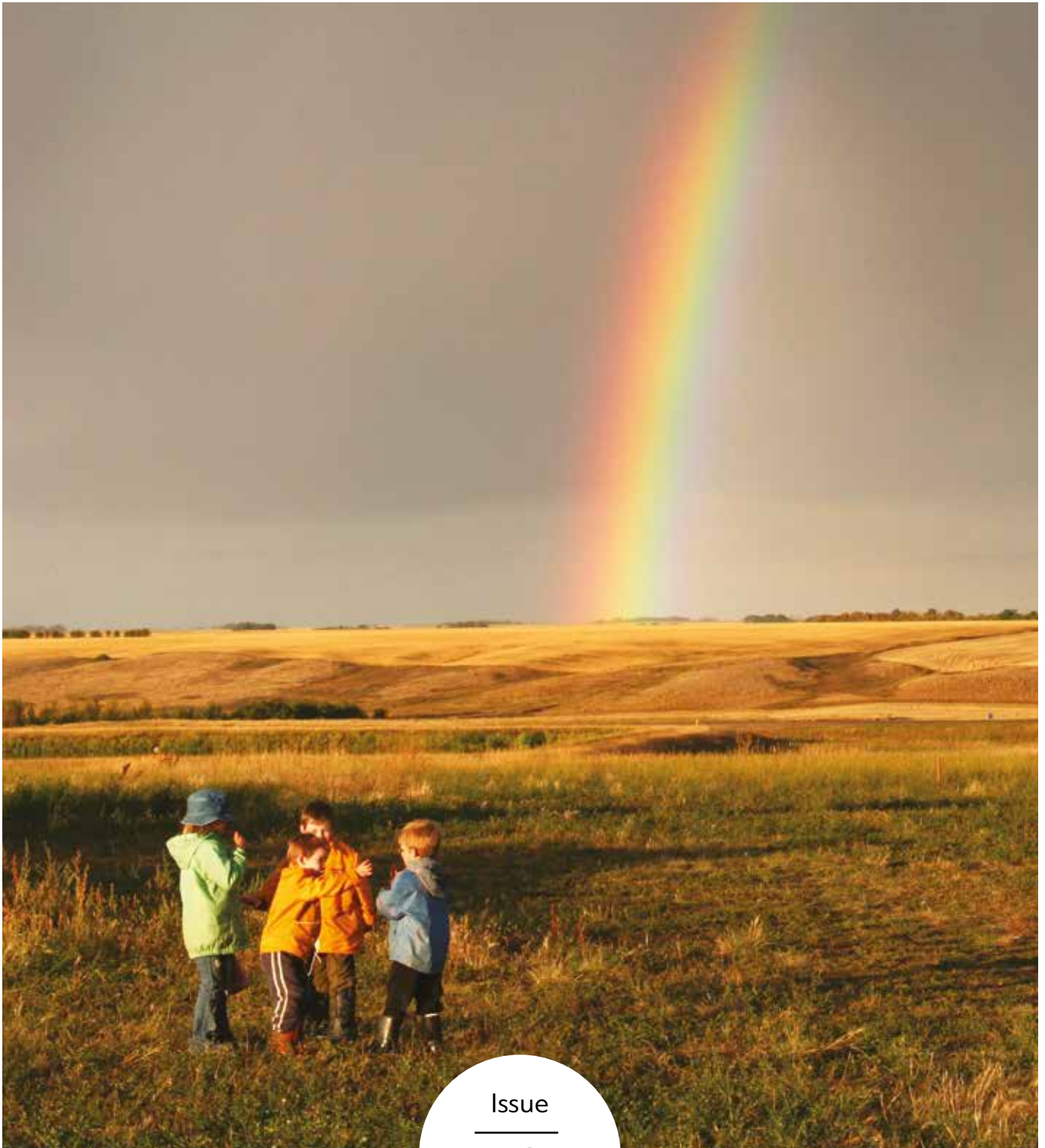

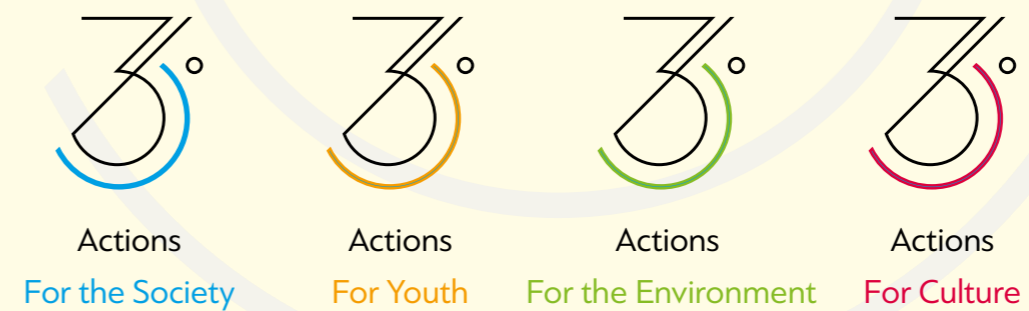

Continuation of the Group's actions to deal with the pandemic



HELLENIC PETROLEUM Group's assistance to both the National Health System and the local communities in which it operates has been continuous and steady, with the provision of critical medical equipment, due to the extremely difficult conditions that the Covid-19 pandemic keeps creating.

In this context, the Group, as an active and responsible social partner, made two new donations:

- Taking into account the ongoing needs in hospitals and the tremendous pressure faced by the ICUs (Intensive Care Units), it donated 50 state-of-the-art high-flow oxygen devices to support hospitals throughout the country and especially in Thessaloniki. A significant number of devices were delivered to AHEPA, IPPOKRATEIO, AGIOS PAVLOS and G. PAPANIKOLAOU general hospitals.

The new equipment enables converting regular hospital beds into HDUs (High Dependency Units), contributing significantly to the decongestion of ICUs, since intubation of patients is - to a large extent - avoided. In addition, the devices are portable, which allows them to be transported and used even in different hospitals, if required by circumstances. This way, the hospital infrastructure and the capacity of the NHS are strengthened.

- Recognizing the increased need for early diagnosis, it donated an additional 5,500 test kits to the THRIASIO General Hospital, following up on previous donations it had made, with the aim of improving the services provided to the citizens and supporting the proper functioning of the hospital.

Environmental Program for the disabled of Megara





The Group supported the "Ilianthos" Day Care Centre of the Association for the Protection and Assistance of Children with Brain Injuries and Disabled People in Megara, in a new effort to expand the knowledge, skills and social participation of its beneficiaries, through an original and experiential environmental education program.

Some of the modules of the program: sea and marine organisms, pollution of the marine environment, water cycle, mountain environment, nature's creations and human's works, animals and plants of Megara, pollen routes, air pollution, water pollution, environmental organizations, etc.

In the first two, successfully completed cycles of the program, the principles of adult education were applied in combination with many outdoors activities, so that the beneficiaries could acquire knowledge empirically and in an extracurricular manner. During the last decade, the HELLENIC PETROLEUM Group has been supporting the institution of the Student Conference on Informatics of Central Macedonia, which celebrated its 13th anniversary this year. It supported the realization of the 2nd online event on 20-23 April 2021 at NOESIS by sponsoring all the necessary electronic equipment for its carrying out. The conference, which is the largest student event for Northern Greece, was attended by 900 students and 180 teachers from Primary and Secondary Education schools of the Region of Central Macedonia. During the Hellenistic era it was a port-station of the Ptolemeans of Egypt and during the Roman era it registered significant growth thanks to its many ports, which were a base against pirates.

Anafi

According to Greek mythology, one night, the Argonauts, who were returning home from Colchis, were caught in a storm. They asked the god Apollo for help to save them and he cast light in the form of thunder and an island appeared in front of them, which they finally approached. There, the Argonauts erected an altar in honour of Apollo "Aeglitis" (= the one who shines) and named it Anafi.

Nisyros

The festival of Panagia Spiliani on August 15 is the best-known custom of the island. After the Vespers service, a fasting dinner and traditional doughnuts are offered. During the Orthros service, the kollyva (boiled wheat) of the Virgin Mary are prepared, accompanied by laments by the "9-day women". The latter are women who have made a vow to spend 9 days and nights of prayer in the cells of the monastery, performing various tasks for the cleaning and preparation of the monastery during the feast.

Tilos

In 2019, Tilos became the first Greek island where a solar charging station for electric vehicles was installed. With the completion of the installation and through the process of net metering, the planned production of the PV station is expected to cover the energy needs of two electric vehicles and to contribute to the coverage of the needs of the electric lighting of the "Tasos Aliferis" coastal sidewalk and the energy consumption of that municipal building.

Symi

The economic prosperity of Symi in the 19th century was mainly based on three sectors: fishing, sponge processing and trading, and shipbuilding/shipping. Sponge fishing flourished from 1865 to 1930, thanks to the new techniques (diving suit). Symi pioneered both the fishing of sponges on the Barbary Coast, on the northern coast of Africa, and their processing and marketing.

Karpathos

It is a rich habitat and, therefore, has protected areas where populations of various endangered fauna species thrive. The northern part of Karpathos, Saria, and its coastal marine zone are protected Natura 2000 habitats, code GR4210003, covering a total area of 112.92 km².

Kithira

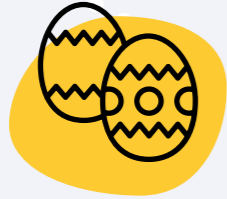

Pirates constantly plundered the ships, beaches and islands of the Mediterranean, and Kithira was the biggest pirate target in the Mediterranean. Paliochora, Kythira, was finally abandoned after being raided and plundered by Hayredin Barbarossa in 1537. After burning Paliochora and killing many civilians, he also sold many captives as slaves.

Chios

The rocket war of Vrontados: The custom of rocket war originated during the Turkish occupation. It is an exchange of fire between the two largest parishes of the town, St. Marc and Panagia Erythiani. In Mesta, on Holy Saturday, the young believers receive the holy light from the priest and light up a large lantern in the village square where they burn the effigy of Judas.

Icaria

The Icarian dance that is danced at the local festivals is very well-known. A popular festival is the one of Agia Marina in the village of Arethousa on July 17, the day that marks the liberation of the island. In Icarian festivals, the organizers are all volunteers from the village, who cook (boiled and roasted goat, potatoes, salads, etc.) and serve, while the orchestra is dominated by the violin, which lends the Icarian dance its special tone.

Herakleia

According to tradition, around the end of the 19th century, a shepherd had lain down under a bush to protect himself from the rain. When he returned to the village, his fellow villagers saw the figure of St. John the Baptist imprinted on his shirt. They asked the shepherd to take them where he had sat and when they went there, they discovered the entrance to a cave. Inside the cave they found the icon of St. John the Baptist and, thus, the cave was named after him.

Limnos

population 17.000



Limnos has had a long tradition of local products, such as dairy products, mainly cheese (melichloro, kaskaval, kalathaki), honey and cereals (rusk, wheat flour and flomaria) as well as a wide variety of wines, both white and red, that have a special taste due to the island's volcanic soil. The most famous variety of red wine is kalambaki.

Agathonisi

Its name, according to the most probable version, means an island with thorns. Its shape resembles a donkey, which is why one of its earliest names was Gaidouronisi (Island of Donkeys). Its current name has been used for the last fifty years or so and the declaration for the renaming of the island was signed by all the inhabitants.

Fournoi

The island is included in the 196 areas of Greece that are important for birds, as it is a breeding place for birds such as hawks and eagles, and the island partridge. It is also an area of particular importance for migratory species, especially herons.

Oenousses

Oinousses is a place of ancient seafaring, linked to the fate and history of neighbouring Chios. The sailors of Oinousses are mentioned by Homer and we know that they played an important role in the battles against the Persians. The island has a naval high school, a Maritime Museum and a Merchant Navy Academy, and is the birthplace of many prominent ship owners.

Schinoussa

The island is famous for its fava beans (1st prize at the Nikolaos Tselementes Cycladic Gastronomy Festival – Sifnos, 2012) and its excellent meat and agricultural products (beef, pork, goat, oil cheese, sour mizithra, kopanisti and string beans), which can be found in local shops or bought directly from their producers.

Imvros

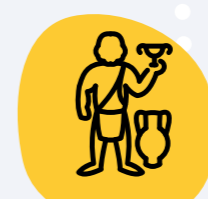

It was named after the Carian god of fertility Imbramos or Imbrasos. Homer informs us that in this critically important corner of the Aegean, between Tenedos and Imvros, Poseidon, the god of the sea, had his horse stables. Also, the goddess Thetis, mother of the heroic Achilles, had her palaces on the seabed between Imvros and Samothrace.

Donoussa

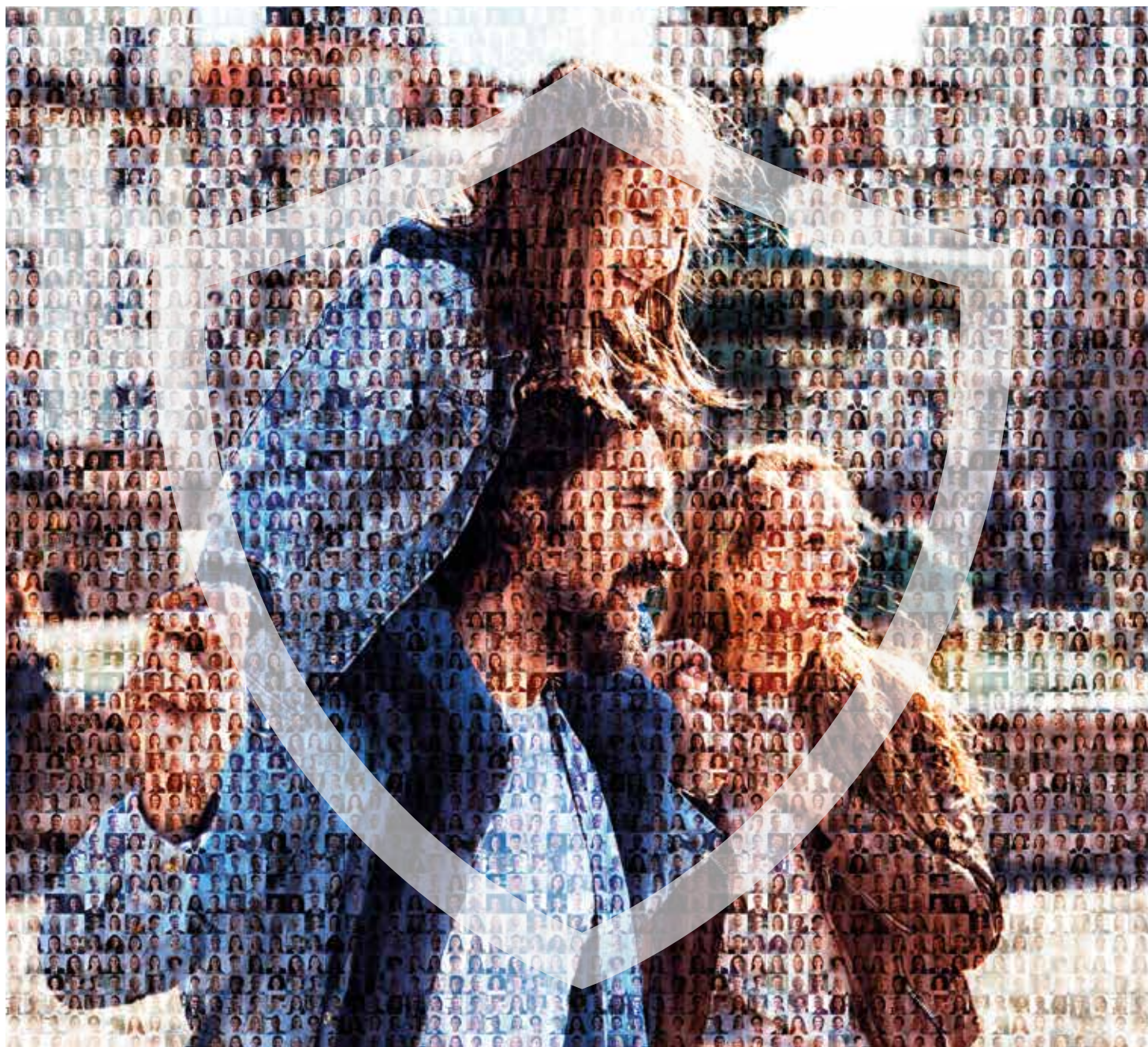

According to ancient Greek mythology, the island was named after the god Dionysus, who lived on this island. Theseus and Ariadne stopped at Donoussa, which was then called "Dia", when they were returning from Crete. Dionysus saw Ariadne and fell madly in love with her. That's why the goddess Athena ordered the hero Theseus to obey Dionysus and leave Ariadne on the island. Thus, Ariadne's fate was to become the inseparable wife of Dionysus.
